"Tell me about yourself" could be considered the hardest, yet also the most asked, interview question. The challenge with this question is that it seems so general — but in truth, hiring managers are looking for a concise 60 to 90-second answer that highlights why you are a good fit for the position you are seeking.

## **Formula**

Here is a formula that will help you create a winning answer to this question. Use the "present-past-future" framework to help you develop your response.

- 1. Present: Who are you? What are you currently doing that is relevant to this position?
- 2. Past: What experiences have prepared you for this position? What skills do you want to highlight?
- 3. Future: Given your past experiences, why are you interviewing for this position? How does it fit into your career goals?

## **Keep in Mind**

A well-thought-out "tell me about yourself" answer includes the following:

- Highlights of your best qualifications and what makes you a unique candidate (this can also set up opportunities for follow-up questions that will allow you to provide more details on experiences that you feel make you well-qualified for the position)
- Points tailored to a specific industry, organization, and role
- Explains why you are targeting that company or changing fields, and why this opportunity is better aligned to your interests, values, and skills
- Follows a clear storyline and is organized to emphasize the task and your skills
- A 60 to 90-second response focused on essential details
